

# Cindy McManus's FAMOUS Creamy Wild Mushroom and Brunost soup

12 T butter 8 shallots, diced

½ tsp dried thyme 40 oz wild mushrooms --Crimini
17 C chicken or vegetable stock 3 cups Heavy Cream
12 ozs Brunost cheese--sliced Salt and pepper

Heat the butter over medium high heat in a large, heavy pot. Toss in diced shallots and thyme and cook 2 minutes, until shallots are soft. Add mushrooms and saute 6-8 minutes until browned. Add stock and simmer uncovered 10 minutes and slightly reduced. Add cheese and heavy cream, stir until combined. Cook 5 minutes longer until heated through. Season with salt and pepper and garnish with fresh thyme. Serves 20.

#### **Guidelines for Sports Medals**

Submit completed Sports Medal cards to your lodge Sports Director, who may place an order for your medals via the Lodge Leader Supply Store.





Congratulations to Sharon Hanson for earning your Silver walking medal! 180 miles and she is working on 270 for GOLD!

Spring is just around the corner and several Harald Haarfager members are working on sports medals. There are several to look into, including Sons of Norway Virtual Pilgrimage. Basically, you log your miles by walking at home, or anywhere, but follow along the route from Oslo to Trondheim in Norway, almost 400 miles. The Gudbrandsdalen route, is the same journey that King Olav Harraldson (St. Olaf) trekked, during his life (995-1030), converting pagan Norway to Christianity. If you were to actually walk the route in Norway, you would need at least 32 days. On your way, you would walk past historical and cultural landmarks, through cultural landscapes and pristine nature, and medieval farms that offer culinary experiences based on locally sourced seasonal ingredients, and a comfortable bed for the night. If you take the virtual route, you will experience nine legs of the journey, including Eidsvoll, Lillehammer, Kvam, Kongsvold, and ending in Trondheim, formally Nidaros.

You might want to check it out. Just log in to your account on the Sons of Norway website, www.SofN.com. Go to member resources, then cultural programming, sports medals, and then virtual pilgrimage. It's tucked away a bit but it looks interesting. Try the link at the end of the article and let us know if you are working on it.



#### NORDIC CULTURE CORNER

### Bergen, Norway Comoposer, Edvard Grieg, 1843 - 1907



On March 22, Harald Haarfager lodge partnered with Tordenskjold lodge for a wonderful musical adventure with composer Steven Luksan and Soprano Laura Loge, both from the Northwest Edvard Greig Society. Laura is the executive director and founder of the organization, whose mission is to promote the music of Edvard Grieg through performance, educational outreach and research in the Northwest of the United States.

Edvard Grieg, a renowned Norwegian composer, was born on June 15, 1843, in Bergen, Norway. He grew up in a musical family, and his talent for music became apparent from an early age. At just 15 years old, he entered the Leipzig Conservatory in Germany to study music, honing his skills in piano and composition. During his time in Leipzig, Grieg was exposed to a variety of musical influences, including the works of Robert Schumann and Franz Liszt. However, he always maintained a strong connection to his Norwegian roots, drawing inspiration from the rugged landscapes and folk traditions of his homeland. Grieg's music is often described as having a distinctly Norwegian character, incorporating elements of folk melodies and dance rhythms into his compositions. Often times, composers find a landscape, experience, picture, poem, or stories that are specific to their homeland and then put the idea to music, creating a work that imparts a musical experience on the listener that has the same sound inflections as the spoken language or is a sound representation of the landscape. For example, one of Greig's most well known pieces, *Morning Moon*, from the first movement of Peer Gynt Suite No. 1, depicts a tranquil and serene Norwegian sunrise, capturing the peaceful awakening of a new day. Delicate melodies played by flutes and oboes, accompanied by strings, evoke the beauty and serenity of the new beginning of a Norwegian morning. Astounding! 


